LUXOR ARMCHAIR BY PACIFIC GREEN



Inspired by the past, the Luxor armchair is a modern piece of furniture designed by Bruce Dowse and Peter Ryan of Pacific Design. whose design draws from ancient Egyptian techniques. The alternating light and dark colors used by the ancient Egyptians in their art and artifacts inspire the chair's striking pattern. The bold, round shape of the armchair is reminiscent of the early 20th-century Art Deco style, with the contrasting rays of leather echoing this influence. This radial pattern also evokes the setting sun, referencing ancient Egyptian ideologies. The base of the chair is crafted from alternating pieces of Bruce and Palmwood, a sustainable material that closely resembles traditional wood. The Luxor armchair is a testament to innovative and sustainable design. Our garment design draws inspiration from the shape and patterns of the Luxor armchair, making it intriguing and unique. Inspired by the layered array on the chair's cover and wood frame, our design incorporates layers of materials and textures throughout the collar and vest while also referencing the construction of the chair in the pants and the vest. Each piece of the garment, from the collar to the shoes, reflects the chair's unique characteristics while still maintaining a strong reference to ancient Egypt.
